


## Rail Safety Task Force December 2022

#### East Houston Focus

- Continue to identify needs and address concerns related to train operations impacting quality of life in East Houston Neighborhoods
- Identify other road safety and mobility concerns within the East Houston area





#### Rail Corridor Collaborative

- Working with railroad companies operating in Houston to identify critical impacts to Houston Emergency Response
- Requesting railroads to engage in quality-of-life initiatives:
  - Neighborhood Clean up
  - Focus Safety Funding











#### Rail Safety Taskforce



- Meet with community and city representatives from neighborhoods affected by railroad operations Identify and prioritize concerns
- Guide district efforts for developing safety and mobility strategies

## Rail Corridor Collaborative (End of Year Report)


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#### METRO BRT

- 1500 Telephone
















- 13 Locations Monitored
- Capturing data on behaviors (train, motorist, pedestrian) at the crossings
- Access is available to participating railroads
- Coordinating with Houston Emergency Services to assist in improving response

## Safety Sync Up


Coordinating with road safety organization to create a unified effort to deliver appropriate safety awareness (Bike, Pedestrian, Rail, Driver, and Vehicle Occupant Protection) in neighborhoods that need it most.

- Created a School Survey to assess appropriate level of safety information
